- 2004** The Planning Commission's Community Design Award of Excellence – Marion Transit Center
These awards encompass recognition for projects that enhance the quality of life, exhibit long-term vision, innovation, design quality and environmental sensitivity.
- 2004** The Planning Commission's Community Design Award of Merit – Southern Transportation Plaza
- 2002** "The Gainesville Solar Walk" (Gainesville, FL)
Description: Situated along a one-mile-long pedestrian walkway, The Solar Walk duplicates the distance of each planet from the sun in a billion-to-one ration. Each of the ten, 14' high sculptures weighs 6,000 pounds and is made from integral colored concrete, embedded glass, geodes, and stones. The sculptures are engraved with drawings, ancient & modern sayings, and have may recycled features, such as bricks from the University of Florida.
- 2000 – 2003** "Broward County Libraries" – Projects for two Broward libraries. Work in progress. (Ft. Lauderdale, FL)
- 2000 – 2003** "HARTLine Marion Transit Center" – HARTLine Bus Center (Tampa, FL)
Description: The architecture and landscaping are based on the theme of the Italian Tuscan Villa. Artworks are based on 17th century Italian Baroque floral motifs, and the area's hibiscus flower. Artworks include the 30' diameter concrete overlay floor in the lobby, the outdoor courtyard of two 20' diameter mosaic hibiscuses and the surrounding tile areas of the tower surround area, and the floral and gold tile clock tower.
Site Budget: \$3,000,000
- 2000 – 2003** "HARTLine Southern Transportation Plaza" (Tampa, FL)
Description: Hillsborough Area Regional Transit Authority's multi-modal downtown transportation plaza. It is situated next to the Tampa Convention Center and the Marriott Waterside. Working with a team of architects, engineers, and the artist, the site was driven by the artist's concept of using an astronomer's star chart and has subtle celestial and transcendental overtones, bridging the old and new areas of Tampa. Artworks include twelve Sentential Light Sculptures, which line the track and flash in sequence to the train's arrival, ten Directional Art Posts that lead visitors into the site, and the Final Jewel atop the structure.
